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## NOTE 1

## 1NT-respond over 1* FG

1NT as respond over $1 *$ is forcing to game with any distribution.
Responding 1 M over $1 *$ doesn't deny FG values but we almost (cannot remember any case we haven't) use 1NT when we will reach at least gamelevel.

Over responses 2 upto $3 *$ relay asks for more specific DIST and from 3 the 4 cheapest bids except $3 N T$ and $4 *$ sets trump and asks for strength and aces. $3 N T$ is for play and $4 \bullet$ is an endsignalbid.

## NOTE 2

## 2*-Opening

Shows 3-10 Hcp and at least 44 i majors. It's unusual w/ 64 DIST but w/ bad 6c suit it is possible. Opening in $2^{\text {nd }}$ position VUL we use to have a decent opening either w/ 55 DIST or maximum HCP.

## NOTE 3

## TRF overcalls vs $1 * /$ that don't promise 3+card suit.

This defence, called "Lützen", can ( and we almost do ) be used vs minoropenings that not promise 3c.
It has also been used vs NAT minor openings, unfourtunally with some success. Although this methods now a days is prohibited in most tournaments we only use it as descripted above.

If OPPT: s Dbl 1^ Rdbl = "I have an own 1A-overcall"
1 A bidder is supposed to save himself by Rdbl as SOS or 2X NAT.
1NT denies MIN. Further Rdbls are SOS.

## NOTE 4

## Vinje signals in trump

If possible, playing low-high in trump shows parity of the hand. 3 suits with an even number of cards and playing high-low show 3 suits with an odd number of cards.

## Obvious shift

Is ON when its obvious not to continue in that suit
Dummy has:
> Singel/void , or its obvious that declarer has
$>$ A suit w/AKQ
> A suit w/ QJ $\mathrm{x}(\mathrm{x})$ and you lead K
> A suit w/ Kxx(x) and you lead A and declarer is probably short
$>$ You lead the A/K and dummy has 2 cards
Low = Intolerance for the obvius shift
High $=$ Tolerance for the obvius shift (Jxx or weaker A or K, Qxx or better A,K or Q)
The obvius shift suit is in priority dummys:

1. Bad three card ( $1 / 3$ )
2. Shortest suit ( not singel/void)
3. W/ equal length the weakest
4. $\mathrm{W} /$ equal strength the lowest

Obvius shift suit is never, in priority:
> The leading suit
> Trumph
> A suit w AKQ or 4 of 5 honors
$>$ Dummys single/void suit
> A suit bid by declarer
Obvius shift is always partners suit or your own suit,
