

## Supplementary notes file (sweden1.txt) ()

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### NOTE 1

1 C - 1 D; 1H (artificial: bal, hearts or minors)

We use 1 S as a relay and show special hands with higher bids. 1 NT, 2 m and 2H are transfer bids, showing:

1. a normal hand, 5+ suit, basically 0-3 HCP with a major; 0-5 with a minor (partner will accept the transfer with up to 21 Bal, unless he has max with a good fit.
2. 5-5 hands with 2-3 HCP (low rebid, 4-5 HCP (3-level rebid, or 6-7 HCP (jump rebid
3. specific invitational hands with a long suit

1 C - 1 D; 1H - 1 S (relay)

- 1 NT 17-19/20 bal, or a suitable semibal minimum
- 2 C 17+, 5+ hearts and a 4+ minor
- 2 D a) 20+, 4 hearts and 5+ diamonds
  - b) 22-23, bal
  - c) 20-23, =1444, or 24+, any 4441 with four hearts
- 2H 17+, both minors (usually unbal)
- 2 S 20+, 4 hearts and 5+ clubs
- 2 NT 20-21, bal

### NOTE 2

1 C - 1 D; 1 S (17-23 with 4+ spades)

Pass very weak, no support

- 1 NT relay, 4-7 HCP
  - 2C=both majors, 2H+ = clubs
- 2 C negative, no support, less than 4/5+ HCP
- 2 D transfer, 5+ hearts and some strength
- 2 H transfer raise, 4-card spade support, 3/4-7 HCP, GI (see 2 NT)
  - 2 S limited values
  - 2 NT general GI
  - 3 m/H SI with a 5-card suit (may be 5-5)
  - 4 m spl
- 2 S 4+support, less than 4 HCP
  - Op bids as above
- 2 NT 4-card spade support plus a splinter, GF

- 2 D 17-19 HCP, 4 hearts and 5+ diamonds
- 2 H GF with 5+ spades, unbal, but not one-suited
- 2 S GF with exactly 4 spades, unbal or =4144
- 2 NT GF, 24+ bal
- 3 x GF with 5440 and touching 4-card suits:

NOTE 14

Responses

The bids in parenthesis show Re's alternatives on the second round of bidding.

- 2 C a) GF Stayman, may check for a 5-card M (3 OM/NT/4 x)
- b) 5 spades, invitational (2 S)
- c) at least 5-4 in the majors, any strength (pass, 2/3 M, 4 m)
- d) weak with a 5+ minor, often with a 4-card M (2 NT, 3 C)
- e) strong with a 4-card M and a 5-card m (2 NT, 3 C)
- f) strong bal with or without a 4-card M (3 D)
- 2 D a) GI with 4-5 hearts (2 S), may have 4 S (2 NT)
- b) 5+ hearts any strength, normally not 4 spades (pass/3 C+)
- 2 H a) GI, 4-5 spades (2 NT)
- b) 5+ spades, any strength, with GI 6+ spades (pass/3 C+)
- 2 S a) GI, bal without a 4-card M (pass/3 NT)
- b) weak with both minors (pass/3 C)
- c) GF, both minors (3 D+)
- 2 NT asks for a weak doubleton
- 3 m GF, 6+suit
- 3 M three-suiter, shortness in the bid suit
- 4 C/D transfer to 4 H/S
- 4 M to play
